The participant of the Competition may choose the content for infographics from the list below, or prepare their own ones referring to the chapters of the Guide. Infographics no. 1 and 2 are mandatory to prepare.

**Suggested infographics no. 1 (mandatory)** Map of the Old Town showing the location of buildings of the Academy of Fine Arts in Gdańsk, along with the information given below:

- Great Armoury, Targ Węglowy 6;
- Small Armoury, Plac Wałowy;
- English House, Chlebnicka street 13/16.

**Suggested infographics no. 2 (mandatory)** Infographics presenting Facts and figures:

Academy of Fine Arts in Gdańsk

- Foundation year 1945,
- 75 years of tradition,
- 3 monumental buildings (the Great Armoury, the English House, the Small Armoury),
- public institution,
- 4 Faculties (Faculty of Architecture and Design, Faculty of Graphics, Faculty of Painting, Faculty of Sculpture and Intermedia),
- Fields of study - 7 (Design, Design of Cultural Landscapes, Interior Design, Graphics, Intermedia, Painting, Sculpture),

4. by ferry.
